Code of Conduct for Visitors:

- Treat all our children and staff equally with respect.
- Ensure that all conversations you hear relating to children, staff or school business remain confidential.
- Please do not use cameras or electronic devices in school, unless agreed by the Headteacher (Deputy Headteacher in absence).
- Mobile phone use is restricted to the staffroom, please ensure your mobile phone is switched off at all other times.
- Please ensure your visitor's badge is visible at all times.
- Inform a member of staff if you observe anything of concern.

Emergency Procedures:

Procedure	Signal	Instruction
Fire	Continuous Alarm	Leave via nearest fire exit and make way calmly, swiftly to assembly point on the front playground line up in classes
Lockdown	Long whistle blast and words 'In'	Enter school calmly and swiftly via nearest entrance point and make way to the hall –line up in classes
Red Card	Red card handed to you	Go to the area instructed on the card ensuring another adult is overseeing children
